





1) Confirming the Covenant (Exodus 24:1-11)

1 Kings 12:28

So the king (Jeroboam) took counsel and made two calves of gold. And he said to the people, "You have gone up to Jerusalem long enough. Behold your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt."

3) Carrying out the Consequences (Exodus 32:15-29)

"The special treasure-people whose identity has been established by the arrival in their midst of the Presence of Yahweh himself are suddenly in danger of becoming a people with no identity at all ... Yahweh will not withdraw his Presence. Though things cannot be the same, because Israel's innocence as the people of Yahweh's Presence has been lost, Yahweh will remain with them still."

3) Carrying out the Consequences (Exodus 32:15-29)

Wait on the Lord

2 Peter 3:8-9

But do not overlook this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance.

Worship the Lord Only

Luke 22:20

And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup that is poured out for you is *the new covenant in my blood*."

Worship the Lord Only

Hebrews 8:6

But as it is, Christ has obtained a ministry that is as much more excellent than the old as *the covenant he mediates is better, since it is enacted on better promises*.

Worship the Lord Only

Hebrews 12:22-24

But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God, the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.
