Kingdom Mission - Generosity (Luke 18:9-30)

## Sermon Recap: To learn how to say enough we must understand Kingdom

**Generosity...its source, its scope, and its surprise**. When we truly encounter God's grace, see generosity as more than giving money, and realize that wealth often suppresses generosity, then we can be a vehicle for others to experience grace. Practicing a lifestyle of simplicity by *not harvesting to the edge* and *giving our first fruits* is the first step toward not missing the mission of kingdom generosity.

**Hook:** These questions can help encourage conversation.

1. How does the fact that a \$33K income is top 1% worldwide impact your view on our country? Where do you see the lie of its "not enough" in our culture?

**Look**: Read the sermon passage. Answer the following textual questions.

- 2. Read 2 Cor. 8:9 and Deut. 26:1-11. How do these passages confirm that grace is the source of generosity?
- 3. Contrast the Pharisee and the tax collector's understanding of grace as the source of generosity. Where are the differences of posture?
- 4. In verses 15-17, how do Jesus' disciples miss the scope of generosity? What does receiving the "kingdom of God like a child" mean?
- 5. How does the Rich man, like the Pharisee from verses 9-14, miss the mission of Kingdom generosity?

**Took**: Applying the message to our lives.

- 6. Where have you been harvesting to the edge financially, emotionally, spiritually or with your time?
- 7. How does the call to practice simplicity (not harvesting to the edge, giving your first fruits financially or spiritually) challenge your expectations of successful living?
